## **Responsibilities**

We are looking for a resident to join our busy small animal surgery department. Training will be done by four ECVS Diplomates and one senior orthopedic surgeon. We have a variable caseload including cases in soft tissue, orthopaedic and neurosurgery. Ideally you are a dedicated team player with some clinical and research experience. Clinical work will include consulting, managing surgical cases and performing surgeries under direct supervision as is mandated by the ECVS residency training guidelines. Emergency out of hour shifts and weekends will also be shared out on a rotating schedule amongst both residents and senior surgeons. Non- clinical work will include teaching duties such as lectures and practical training sessions for students and time to work on research projects. Two scientific publications will need to be submitted and accepted before the end of the 3- year residency programme. We recommend that all interested applicants read the ECVS residency training guidelines.
